**Talking with Children about Gender: A Follow-up to *Parenting Beyond Pink and Blue***

Children formulate ideas about gender based on their own lived experience and the messages of their environment. In this interactive workshop presented as a follow-up to January's *Parenting Beyond Pink and Blue*, parents, caregivers, and school personnel will have the opportunity to discuss how we respond to children's questions, concerns, and "gender-alizations" in age-appropriate ways that honor difference, promote equity, and keep the lines of communication open for future conversations. **BIKE SAFETY RODEO WEDNESDAY 28OCTOBER 2015 1:30-3:30 pm**

Just a reminder that this week , right after early dismissal, our SIPAT endorsed Walk Bike Bus Carpool (WBBC) Program will, in collaboration with the community-based Davis Bicycles School Committee and the City of Davis Street Smart Program, be putting on our annual Bike Safety Rodeo on the playground.

Parents must complete and SIGN the ATTACHED CONSENT form for their kids to participate. Please print out the form, sign and turn it into the office in the designated envelope or bring this to the event. Your child should have a signed consent, helmet, and bike (in good working order) to participate. Kids who come dressed up in Halloween costume are INSTANT prize winners!

**PARENT VOLUNTEERS STILL NEEDED FOR RODEO**

It takes a minimum of 12 volunteers to pull off this event, and thus far, we are a little short on CCE parent volunteers. We will fill in as appropriate with available community volunteers, but if CCE families can help, this would be great. If you are able to help out starting at 1 pm, please email the WBBC coordinator at [beckergolde@comcast.net](mailto:beckergolde@comcast.net).

Volunteers needed for setting up and monitoring the following:

- 2 adults for Check In/Check Out Station
- 3 adult helmet checkers
- 2 adult bike checkers
- 1 adult supervising the scan, signal and merge station
- 1 adult supervising the Figure 8 navigating station
- 1 adult supervising the stop, signal and turn station
- 1 adult supervising the traffic signs/rules of the road station
- 1 adult supervising the Mini SLOW race

The rodeo is designed for children who have the basic skills of bike riding down (Example: knowing, at a minimum, how to stop and start properly and how to take one hand off the handle bars to signal). This year, for the first time, we are offering a new in-class option for kindergarteners who may be brand new to navigating the streets on their bikes. WBBC will work with our principal and the kindergarten teachers to schedule having a volunteer trainer come in to speak to kids about bike safety.

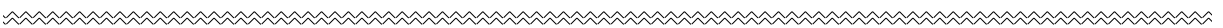

Cesar Chavez students are invited to Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF, again, this year. Last year, we are proud that Chavez students raised \$2706.25.

We are keeping the process totally simple. We will distribute one box to every student the week before Halloween, and we will collect boxes in the front office over the week after Halloween. If your family does not want to participate, that is perfectly fine, please send the box back to be recycled.

We see Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF as a nice compliment to the international education our children receive at Chavez. It promotes international awareness and action. In the spirit of Cesar Chavez who said, "The end of all education should surely be service to others."

Impact:

- Just \$1 gives a child 40 days of clean, safe water
- Just \$5 feeds a malnourished child for 5 days
- Just \$10 vaccinates 280 children
- \$30 vaccinates 100 kids from measles
- \$100 protects 100 kids from malaria
- \$500 installs a water pump to serve a whole village

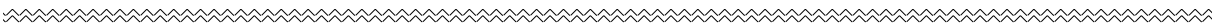
October 28th - Bike Safety Rodeo
