Dr. Fred Brill, Superintendent of the Lafayette School District will speak on Wednesday, November 28, at 7:00 p.m. at the Harper Junior High MPR in Davis.

Dr. Brill will explain how the Lafayette district recently adapted from a GATE program model in

which 20 - 30% of students were assigned to segregated classrooms, to one where nearly all students stay at their neighborhood/home elementary schools, teachers are supported and encouraged to provide differentiated instruction for students at all learning levels, and test scores across the spectrum continue to be outstanding.

Dr. Brill's visit is timely because the DJUSD GATE Master Plan is up for revision/renewal in June of 2013 and gaining insight into alternatives can help inform that process.

Everyone in the Davis community, including Principals, Administrators, Teachers, elected officials, parents, grandparents and others, is cordially invited to attend this event and welcome Dr. Brill to Davis.

Thank you to the many families participating in the CCE Walk and Bike to School Program. You have helped make for a very successful Program launch.
After one week, the program has 77 registered participants -- almost 15% of our student population. Just for registering and for riding a total of 3 times between November 1-16th, your child will be eligible to win a new bike basket, bike bell or lock. Congratulations and thank you.

As a reminder, teachers and other school staff are welcome to join the program. For parents who ride to school with their kids, you have an option to enroll as a family, which will allow you to track the total mileage for all individuals in your family. Also, the program allows for the enrollment of children who park-and-walk, carpool or take the bus to school. Dear parents,

In the last two weeks we had had a few cases of lice in the school. In all cases we found that parents might not have the information of the school procedures for reporting lice. Please help us contain any possible infestation by following these procedures:

The school office should be notified immediately after you suspect that your child has head lice!

1. If you suspect or have a confirmed case of lice make sure you stop by the office before you bring your child into the classroom.
2. If you are calling in an absence due to head lice make sure you let us know at that time that head lice is the reason for the absence.
3. A note will be sent home to all families in your child's classroom as soon as the office knows about the case. This will occur as soon as you come to the office or you call us to explain an absence due to head lice.
4. Before bringing your child to re-enter the school, the secretary in the office will need to talk to you and check your child.

Dear CCE families,

The future of your DJUSD student's education is at stake in this election. School closures, course offering, and the potential loss of 100 teaching and staff position are in the balance.

Measure E renews Measure A funding and provides for a safety net of funding if Prop 30 fails. **If Prop 30 and Measure E pass, you will see no change in your property taxes - you will pay what you currently pay today - \$43 per month to fund Davis schools.**

If Prop 30 fails and Measure E passes, Davis property owners will pay \$20 more per month to fund Davis schools, a total of about \$63 per month to maintain our current DJUSD program.

If Measure E and Prop 30 fail, our district will take an immediate hit of \$3.7 million this year most likely resulting in the shortening of the school year.

If Measure E and Prop 30 fail, the district will also have to plan for that same shortfall of \$3.7 million, plus \$3.2 million (Measure A funding), for a total shortfall of \$6.9 million in 2013-14 and beyond.

As parents in a state that does not fund education well, we must advocate for our students. We must exercise local control of a broken system.

We are not alone. Other school districts throughout California are looking at the same solution – a local parcel tax.

Measure E has been endorsed by the Davis Enterprise, the Sacramento Bee, numerous Davis PTAs/PTOs/booster clubs, the Davis Chamber of Commerce, Davis Schools Foundation, the entire Davis City Council, and our Davis-based Yolo County supervisors Jim Provenza and Don Saylor.

Please vote yes on Measure E and Prop 30 and other ballot initiatives that help fund education.
