Davis Police Department received a report on May 29, 2014, at 1:48 p.m., that an adult female was walking in Barovetto Park, near the intersection of Arroyo Avenue and Alhambra Drive in Davis. A male approached her and grabbed her from behind, pulled her dress up and attempted to sexually assault her. The victim was able to break free from the suspect and run to a nearby residence for help. The victim was not injured and last saw the suspect near a bus stop at Alhambra Drive. The suspect was described as white male adult, about 30 years old, 5'10" to 6'00", medium build, and no facial hair. He was last seen wearing a dark color baseball hat, red t-shirt, khaki shorts, and dark brown "UGG" style slippers or boating shoes.

Please impress upon your children to follow these basic rules when walking to or from school:

- Do not talk to strangers, even if they know your name!
- · Always walk directly to and from school using the same path everyday.
- · Always walk or ride your bike with a group of friends.
- · Run directly to school or home if you are approached by a stranger.
- · Immediately notify a school official or parent if you are approached by a stranger.

El Departamento de Policía de Davis recibió una denuncia el 29 de mayo a las 1:48 p.m., de una mujer adulta que caminaba por Barovetto Park, cerca del cruce de Arroyo Avenue y Alhambra Drive en Davis. Un hombre se le acercó y la tomó por detrás, arrancó su vestido e intentó abusar sexualmente de ella. La víctima logró escapar del sospechoso y corrió a pedir ayuda a una residencia cercana. La víctima no sufrió lesiones y vio por última vez al sospechoso cerca de una parada de autobús en Alhambra Drive. El sospechoso fue descrito como un adulto masculino caucásico, de unos 30 años, 5'10" a 6'00", de complexión mediana y sin vello facial. La última vez que fue visto llevaba una gorra de baseball de color oscuro, una camiseta roja, pantalones cortos

khaki y zapatillas marrón oscuro estilo "UGG" o zapatillas náuticas.

Just a reminder that this Friday, 23May2014, is the deadline for Active4Me participants to turn in their order forms.

This is the last Monkey Money Mart of the year and the last opportunity for participants to spend their hard-earned

virtual money. Kids can continue to use the SAME BARCODE next school year, but their accounts DO NOT carry their money over into the 2014-2015 school year.

Here is how it works:

Registered Active4Me participants earn Monkey Money when they bike ride, walk, bus, park-and-walk and carpool to campus. This is NOT real money but VIRTUAL money that is saved in each kid's bar code account.

They earn 10 cents per TRIP to campus.

Twice a year, WBBC hosts a Monkey Money Mart where kids can take this virtual money out of their accounts to purchase things.

On Saturday, April 12 a major fire spread throughout the hills of Valparaíso, the main port city of Chile. Over 2,000 homes were completely burned, almost 10,000 people were evacuated, and 15 people died.

Wonderful news...César Chávez Elementary has been chosen as a California Distinguished School! This program "honors some of California's most exemplary and inspiring public schools. Schools selected for the Distinguished School Award demonstrate significant gains in narrowing the achievement gap." In November, based on API scores, CCE was notified of our eligibility to submit a CDS application, due in December. Our application focused on two "signature practice" areas: 1) A Collaborative, Systematic and Data-Driven Reading Program, and 2) Parent Partnership Initiatives. In these areas, we highlighted our effective reading program and the many parent-led programs (Círculo, Playworks, Climate Survey, Parent Education meetings, etc.) that contribute to the academic and social-emotional growth of our students.

A site visit occurred in mid-April where representatives visited CCE to validate our application and consider recommending us for the award. This week we were notified of our selection.
